The Business Meeting was held immediately after the ASDE Workshop “Classroom Assessment of Ethical Reasoning” presented by Mickey Bebeau, Marilyn Lantz and Phyllis Beemsterboer. The workshop was fully subscribed and most participants remained in the room till the end of the three hour session. Comments from participants were very positive.

Presidents Report: President Beemsterboer opened the meeting with a welcome and an acknowledgement of ASDE officially being a section of the American College of Dentists.

Editor’s Report on Issues in Dental Ethics: President Beemsterboer presented a report from Dr. Jim Rule, Co-Editor requesting more authorship for the Issues in Dental Ethics section of the ACD Journal. The newer Case/Commentary format was discussed and all members were encouraged to provide submission for publication. The ACD Journal is published four times a year.

Treasury Report: Larry Jenson, Treasurer, presented a report on ASDE’s financial status. Jenson reported on the fiscal year 2/15/10 to 2-/15/11. Funds could be directed to effective ways of increasing authorship in ethics and drawing attention to ASDE’s Ozar-Hasegawa Award.

Ozar/Hasegawa Award Report:

Pam Zarkowski, Member at large reported that two dental students won the Ozar/Hasegawa Award for 2010. There were a total of ten submissions. The two winners were contacted and will receive recognition in our newsletter and publication on our website. Each student will receive \$500 and a certificate. Dr. Ralls announced that ACD will provide \$250.00 annually toward the Ozar/Hasegawa Award.

SPEC Report: Alvin Rosenblum, President Elect, discussed the ongoing success of the student run ethics clubs. 24 schools are currently involved. SPEC will hold its first national

meeting in October at the ACD meeting. SPEC continues to grow in membership and recognition.

Fred More NYU: Dr. More formally requested volunteers to help him review and comment on his extensive collection of ethics cases. He would like the insight and support of ASDE members in reviewing these cases and creating commentary around them. The Board had supported his request and he was delighted to have a number of folks respond to be reviewers.

Future Programming: The membership was asked to suggest future programming ideas that ASDE could provide or support. Workshops at ADEA continue to be popular with this year's offering no exception. Ideas suggested included more on curriculum development for ethics education, institutional impact of ethics education, anything faculty development and materials such as in the professional ethics initiative (PEI).
