**Learning Objectives:**  
*This program will create an opportunity for participants to explore in depth a range of possible institutional responses to student academic misconduct using a “systems” framework. It will offer participants an opportunity to reflect on and refine their instructional methods and explore administrative interventions to address academic misconduct. In addition, it will also help participants develop an understanding of how the unintended consequences of our “formal” curricula can undermine our efforts to create learning environments that support integrity.*

**Summary of topics, themes, or issues to be addressed:**

- *Student academic misconduct issues encountered in graduate dental, dental, and allied dental education programs*
- *curricular responses to address academic misconduct*
- *administrative responses to address academic misconduct*
- *addressing “educational cultural issues,” the hidden curriculum that constitutes threats to academic integrity and formal attempts to address academic misconduct*

**Importance to ADEA Members:**  
*All dental schools and all dental school programs, graduate/postdoctoral, predoctoral, and allied dental, must deal with lapses in professionalism by their*

*students. The goal of this program is to provide a forum for discussing a range of institutional responses to address student academic misconduct, and particularly to move toward developing a “systems” framework for understanding, managing, and ultimately reducing the incidence of academic misconduct. The program will discuss curricular as well as administrative strategies for dealing with academic misconduct and for encouraging a culture of integrity. It will also explore the role of the “hidden curriculum” as an environmental threat to professionalism, and will describe why the “hidden curriculum” must be considered as faculty plan interventions to address academic misconduct and foster a culture of integrity in dental schools.*

*Introduction – T. Thierer, University of Rochester – 5 minutes*

*1. Recent academic misconduct issues faced by dental schools – “organized” academic misconduct by groups of dental school seniors at two schools. One school’s experience – what happened and how what happened is being understood by the school. 10 minutes, M. McClain and C. Mobley, University of Nevada Las Vegas*

*2. Curriculum strategies that encourage students to reflect on and resolve ethical dilemmas encountered in the dental school setting – refining the formal curriculum to support an environment of integrity – 20 minutes, P. Zarkowski and D. Hoelscher, University of Detroit Mercy*

*3. Administrative responses to academic misconduct – honor codes and processes, and faculty development – 20 minutes, L. Garetto, Indiana University*

*4. Exposing the “hidden curriculum” – understanding the impact of institutional educational culture on curricular and administrative attempts to address academic misconduct – 20 minutes, M. Lantz, University of Michigan*
